Dear Pennsylvania District Attorneys Association:

The Centre County District Attorney's Office, spearheaded by DA Stacy Parks Miller, is utilizing nonfeasance in order to resist my attempts to use private criminal complaints to hold public officials responsible for their crimes. Because criminal complaints are an entirely underutilized tool, one which is available to hold public officials responsible for criminal misconduct in between elections, I need your help restore integrity to prosecutorial law enforcement in Centre County.

I ran a sting operation on this Centre County DA's Office, from September 25, 2016 to-date ongoing, filing private criminal complaints which have received neither approval or disapproval without unreasonable delay per Pa.R.Crim.P., Rule 506, nor acknowledgement. In doing so, no district attorney or assistant district attorney has been found without criminal culpability. The original complaint has been outstanding for over nine months. The next complaint against Stacy Parks Miller has been outstanding for over two months. This nonfeasance, 16 P.S. § 411, subjects the entire prosecutorial staff to removal of office upon conviction of this misbehavior in office, see Pa. Const. art. VI, § 7 and 16 P.S. § 450(a), each person now having been responsible for the entire failure of following the rules for so long.

My fellow citizens about Pennsylvania believe that criminal complaints will be ignored or denied out of hand. Because of this, they are afraid to file, and to appeal. They lose faith in the tool, and then have lost faith in the system and the government agents involved in carrying out that system. Yet, private criminal complaints and prosecutions initiated and carried out by private parties, make up the bulk of our history in Pennsylvania. In re Hickson, 573 Pa. 127, 137-139, 821 A.2d 1238, 1244-1245 (2003).

Stacy Parks Miller has already failed to get the Courts of Common Pleas to rule, and the Pa. Supreme Court to hear on merits, that the County Code provisions for private prosecution have been displaced by the Commonwealth Attorneys Act. Stacy Parks Miller v. Bellefonte PD, Centre Co. Cmmsrs. & Solicitor, Centre County Court of Common Pleas, et al, 631 Pa. 283, 110 A.3d 992 (2015). There remains no reason the County Code should not be used to maintain the requirement that these people do their jobs.

An entire county of prosecutors whom will not do their jobs is denigration to the Pennsylvania District Attorneys Association and prosecutors everywhere. I just want my officials to follow the law, which I believe is so little to ask. Enclosed are copies of the complaints. Please help.
